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Suggested Solutions

| Possible | Solution |

| 18 | Hydrate – to add water to something (opp: dehydrate – to dry out). |
| | Hydrogenate/hydrogenation – addition of a hydrogen atom to a molecule. |
| | Hydrocarbon – organic compounds containing only carbon and hydrogen. |
| | Hydrochloric acid – an acid made of hydrogen and chlorine, found naturally in your stomach. |
| | Hydroelectricity – use of water to drives turbines to generate electricity. |
| | Hydraulic – machines (e.g. jacks) that use water under pressure instead of cogs and levers. |
| | Hydrolysis – break a compound apart by taking a water molecule away from the compound. |
| | Hydrostatic – water under pressure creating a support structure. |
| | Hydrotropism – plant growth towards water. |
